



Emperor Maximilian's Triumphal Procession is a monument of superlatives in art history. With the commissioning this huge picture frieze around 1510, he began an ambitious printing project which eclipsed all others.

In addition to the one-hour «Triumph» concerts, three «Kurzweyl» concerts by young ensembles and talks by special guests will illuminate other aspects of Maximilian's musical landscape.





Born around 1490 in Basel or Zurich, Ludwig Senf is rightly considered Switzerland's most famous Renaissance composer.






ReRenaissance unites the musicians of Basel, the hotspot for early music, for a gala concert which brings the famous musical miniatures of Maximilian's Triumphal Procession to life in a blaze of color on the grand stage of the Martinskirche.

Between bursts of trumpet fanfare, the loud wind band of the Alta Cappella gives way to the softer sounds of the Bassa Cappella. Secular songs, motets, and dance compositions spotlight a full array of textures, from soloistic performance and purely vocal groups to grand tutti settings with up to 30 musicians.

They represent the pinnacle of the art of song at the court of Emperor Maximilian: they include works by Hofhaimer and Senfl, but also anonymous movements of the highest quality from the court chapel.
